

International Society of Equine Locomotor Pathology Certification Examination Requirements

Thank you for your interest in becoming an ISELP-Certified Practitioner.
The following information is provided to help you prepare for the certification exam.

Exam Eligibility Requirements

To sit the exam, practitioners must:

- Have five years of equine practice experience.
- Have been an ISELP member for at least one (1) year.
- Have attended each of the 8 modules, both seminars and wet-labs.
- Submit 10 video documented PowerPoint cases.
- Critical Critique of Ten (10) Peer Reviewed Scientific Papers

Required Materials

The following materials must be submitted **two (2) months prior to the exam date**:
Please review the material requirements carefully as candidates who submit incomplete material will not be considered. For your convenience, a pre-submission checklist is provided below.

1) Curriculum Vitae

- Must include number of years in practice, duration of ISELP membership, and current photograph.

2) List of Modules Attended

- Word or PDF document including location and topics.

3) Submit 10 video documented PowerPoint cases

- Cases must be presented in ten (10) separate, clearly identified PowerPoint or Keynote files.
- Each case must include at least two (2) photos of physical examination, videos of dynamic examination, and at least one imaging procedure.
- Video clips should be integrated into the presentations as well as provided as separate files.

- Videos of the clinical examination should be divided into separate clips - e.g. before blocks, first block, second block - rather than on a single lengthy recording.
- All diagnostic information must be included, but each video should provide unique information and should not repeat data.
- Ensure that all data within a case is from that case. If data from another, similar case is included (e.g. in the discussion section), explain why and provide a clear indication of your objective.
- Ensure that you have completely examined each case. If a horse presents symptoms not directly related to the main focus of the case, discuss these symptoms or explain why you chose to disregard them.
- **There is an example of how the case studies should be presented on the website.**

4) Critical Critique of Ten (10) Peer Reviewed Scientific Papers Related to Sports Medicine/Imaging Topics

- Papers must be from a minimum of four (4) different journals/proceedings. Submit only full scientific papers; abstracts are not acceptable.
- Provide a PDF or other full-color visual of the original papers numbered one (1) through ten (10).
- Provide a PDF or other full-color visual of your review using the same numbers from one (1) through ten (10).

General Requirements

- Recognized abbreviations include: LF, RF, LH, RH, IA, US, RX, MRI, Scinti. All other abbreviations must be clearly introduced/explained at the first mention.
- Use international nomenclature.
- Minimum letter size should be 20.

Pre-Submission Checklist

- Materials are provided as separate files on a single USB drive.
- Completed materials should be sent as one packet.
- All material is clearly identified with your name.
- All required materials are included:
 - Curriculum Vitae
 - List of Modules Attended
 - Documented Cases
 - Review of Scientific Papers
- You have registered and paid for the exam and are submitting these materials at least two (2) months prior to the exam date.

- Bring your own computer and materials for the test!
